## Dear Members & Friends

Hello and welcome to the April 2006 newsletter which I am composing at the end of March following another busy spell of PC Consultancy, and performing my caring role. Mary is still on extended bed rest but the pressure sores are healing but I am advised another month or so will be needed.

Following my consultant visit earlier this month, my PSA is now 0.4 (creeping up from the 0.32 after the operation last October). So I am on course for Radiotherapy as in some of the removed samples they found some traces of Prostate cancer in my seminal vessels. I have already started Hormone treatment, initially with Cyproterone Acetate tablets for 3-weeks, and then 4-weekly Zoladex abdomen injections starting at the end of this week. I see the team again in early May when my situation is reviewed, together with the results of another MRI scan prior to this. One conclusion concerns the IMRT (Intensity Modulated Radiotherapy) and when it will be started, this could be in 3-months time, or delayed by up to 6-months. When commenced I have been informed that it will be 7-weeks, 5-days a week, 15mins a session. Anyway that's enough about me so to the newsletter proper.

Another year has gone by quickly and here we are at the 2006 AGM to be held on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> April. We hope we get a good turnout, as this is a barometer of the health of the club and endorsement of the work the committee does.

The other meeting this month is the regular "Fix-It" and "Move-It On" Meeting on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> April at Terra Nova. Please note that this is a week later than normal due to the third Monday being Easter Monday. More about these below but firstly:

## CHAIRMAN THOUGHT of the MONTH - April 2006 - 36<sup>th</sup> and Final Thoughts



The club dinner was another pleasant affair with very tasty food served up to the 22 club members present. Due to a wedding party in full swing in another room, the service was a trifle slow but what the heck, the company was great!

The next A meeting will be our AGM and your presence is welcome, not least you can shape the way the club runs and who holds the reins...I shall speak more at the meeting (not sure if that is an incentive or not).

As I write this I have two more days to run until the start of the school holidays and it will be a welcome break. I seem to be ever busier (almost certainly self-inflicted however) but what with building portable aeriels, and having proven them as viable, helping 3 foundation stations duplicate the results ready for their own Easter holidays (so they can go portable) it's been busy on the radio front too. The Greenpower car has inevitable absorbed time (3 Saturdays so far and about half done) so more effort will be required over Easter if that is to race on the 30<sup>th</sup> April. On the car front we have picked up another sponsor in the shape of Adaptive Modules Ltd (see <http://www.adaptblue.com/>). They are the UK agents for Maxstream Zigbee radio data modules that we are moving all our telemetry too (thanks to Roger, G8HDP for mentioning zigbee about a year ago...). Operating on 2.3 GHz, full data on these handy little gadgets can be found at [http://www.adaptblue.com/pdf/datasheet\\_xbee\\_oem-rf-module.pdf](http://www.adaptblue.com/pdf/datasheet_xbee_oem-rf-module.pdf). The company are supplying three modules (2 to use, 1 as spare) F.O.C. for our endeavours. With the easy option of adding one of the many wi-fi aerial designs that abound on the internet, it is feasible that we could get live telemetry from the whole track. Time will tell....

Noises about how the internet will 'kill' amateur radio seem to have died down recently. In pursuit of knowledge I have recently subscribed to the SOTA, HFPAK and G-QRP email reflectors. The ease with which answers, ideas and problems can be aired, shared or solved is partly why I'm so knackered - I have been trying to move stuff on, several fronts at a time!! It's all enriched my life though and given me yet more things to do. What is interesting though, the more you dig around something the broader the applications become. Searching for more power to use portable I turned to Li-Ion laptop batteries. As usual there is a whole load of nonsense about using and caring for them but little things like the manufacturers data sheet reveals all. Ebay can source most things and quite by chance I happened on a 8.8 A/Hr laptop pack for a mere £40 (12 volts nominal). I have yet to buy one as I have sourced other lower capacity cells that together will do the same job, but it does show what can be had if you know what you want. Poorly described or wrong category stuff often passes through for little more than the postage costs and given the original cost of these packs is often over £100 they represent good value for money and are very light. Eg, 4.5 A/Hr at 12 volts, just 400 grams!! That will do for an hour or two up a mountain. Whilst searching for JST connector (beloved of aero-modellers and used by our electric planes) I happened across another cheap site - [www.component-shop.co.uk](http://www.component-shop.co.uk). They have made me a 2.4 A/Hr ni-mh pack for my FT-817 - wait for this ...for £8!! Users of this radio may wish to avail themselves of such a pack, quoting FT-817 pack, it will give 2.4 times what the standard one gives and costs about a 1/6<sup>th</sup> of a lesser capacity 'better' pack. I have asked for a JST connector on it to replace the tiny and weak Yaesu one, and will modify the radio internally to suit, but I doubt I'll ever need to take it out! In terms of fusing this merry little lot of chemical energy, I shall be using some nice things called poly-fuses, made by Raychem. Basically self-resetting thermal fuses, they will save any disasters. At the end of the day, lead acid car batteries can be just as nasty, so don't try any of this at home unless you 'know what you are doing'....

You may realise that this is my last 'Thoughts of' as chairman. Fear not .....at least two people have said they enjoy the read every month so I will continue as '...from our Hayes, Kent correspondent'. See you at the AGM.

I am not sure of the mechanism exactly but often at sunrise and sunset when there are ice crystals in the upper atmosphere you can see three sometimes four faint images of the sun at 12, 3, 6 and 9 o'clock and offset from the true bearing of the sun by quite a large angle. If your photograph was taken during clear cold weather then this is a likely explanation. I have never noticed the phenomenon here in the U.K. There is probably something about it on the web.

### GB2RA at Firepower



Who or what is Firepower? The answer? It's the name of the Museum of the Royal Regiment of Artillery located at the former Royal Arsenal site at Woolwich in SE London (free public car parking available or five minutes walk from BR Station). The Museum houses a comprehensive display of guns and artillery memorabilia through the ages, and is, of course, also the location for an existing Amateur Radio Station, call sign GB2RA

Note that this special event call sign will be operational only for the month of April (from 8th to 17th 2006). A special QSL card will be available and cards for "eyeball" contacts at any time. We would welcome your help with running the station or just call in and say hello. There will be free entry to the Museum for those who can come and spare the time to help; we plan operation every day in the school holidays. Watch out in June for a really special call GB150VC from the same location.

It is hoped to occasionally operate vintage Military equipment, but, regrettably the Woolwich Arsenal site is not the best electrical environment (only some 15m asl) and the low RF output of the Pye designed WS19HP and the Plessey PRC320 limits the range achievable on HF.

### DTI Consultation on Fixed Penalty On the Spot Fines for Amateurs

This consultation was launched in December and has a deadline of 31<sup>st</sup> March, just two days away!

Subject to this DTI consultation, Ofcom would also be able to use on-the-spot fines in the region of £100 for offences such as operating Amateur Radio equipment without a licence or outside the conditions of a licence. Like parking tickets, these would be easier to use/impose as they wouldn't need costly court action.

For serious cases of misuse, Ofcom will still prosecute, for which the maximum penalty on conviction is a £5,000 fine and/or six months imprisonment. The courts may also order forfeiture of any radio apparatus used in connection with an offence.

Note that responses to this consultation are sent to the DTI and not Ofcom.

Amateurs need to respond to the consultation NOW to ensure we have an effective mechanism to enforce the wireless telegraphy legislation. Fixed Penalty fines are a good way of achieving this, however, it could be considered that the system proposed by the DTI is too lenient as once a fine is levied, that offence/history doesn't count for future re-occurrences.

To help ensure a good response from Amateurs the Chelmsford Amateur Radio Society has prepared a Preformatted Reply Sheet in Word to use when replying to the consultation. It can be downloaded from
